Dear Annie,

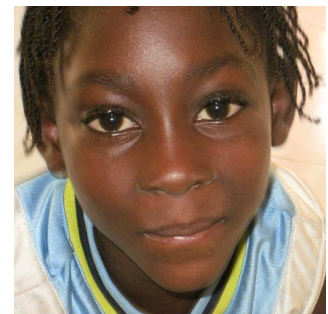

These teens, age 16 and 17, bonded with the orphans. The trip affected them more than I realized. It's the Holy Spirit, Haiti and our orphans that changes lives, not me. If you are interested in going to Haiti let me know. I love taking groups and will be there for about three months this winter so come for a week or two.

We have a new orphan. His name is Bidoury and he's 7. He lived on the island of La Gonave which is even poorer than the big island of Haiti. Bidoury is a very sweet, cute little boy, but... he is very crippled and he has to walk on all fours using his hands and feet. His legs and feet are deformed. His Mom has been praying and praying for someone to help him and even somehow in spite of her severe poverty has managed to get him a passport. So we are her answer to prayer. The Holy Spirit and Chuck Larsen, one of the well drillers, found him for us. What a huge blessing this little boy is to us. Thank you Jesus for our newest child. I have already contacted some of the best orthopedic surgeons that I met in Haiti right after the earthquake to see what can be done for Bidoury so let's keep praying.



Thank you for your response in sponsoring kids. We still have a few children that need sponsors. One of our sponsors has given me some toys to take to the children she is sponsoring the next time I go to Haiti.
