The horrific, unimaginable, violence is escalating in Haiti. Please continue to pray for peace and that God blesses Haiti like never before! I often have to remind myself that God is in control and we must trust in Him.

The gangs came to Montrouis and burned our police station and jail then destroyed our mayor's home. The gangs took over our town with men and guns everywhere including young boys on the street corners with huge guns.

My extraordinary partner, Roberto, in 2 days, arranged a bus for his family, our children and two nannies and

our cook. They had to leave so suddenly and hide our two trucks up in the mountains away from the gangs.

< I was able to ship coloring books, crayons, card games and dominoes.

They then traveled north ten hours to Cap Haitian where my great friend, Bob Easton, is founder of Mission II (to) Haiti responsible for digging and repairing wells. Bob has blessed us with a safe place at his compound where there are no longer heard gun shots, often all day and all night. We just can't thank

him and his wife enough.

His wife's church loaned us propane stoves, pots and pans. Roberto and his wife had to go buy dishes, mattresses, food and staples since everything got left behind. Praise God, because Cap Haitian is safe. Missionary Flights International, which we belong to, have been able to fly cargo where Roberto and Bob pay customs and pick it up at the airport. I immediately shipped boxes of clothes etc. that was already boxed waiting to go. Then, ordered on Amazon towels, sheets, 2 tents, travel bags, etc. including thin fleece blankets that my friend, Chris Laura, purchased.

Guiberline has lived with us since age 7. She is now in her third year of nursing school. I love going to Goodwill and Walmart sales to find her nice clothes that I sent in this photo.>

They all have adjusted so well. Our newest boy, Cossins, who watched the gangs shoot his mother, has been living with us for over a year, and now, had to go through fleeing again for safety. He's doing great and they continue to praise God through devotions, singing and prayer.






<Gideon no longer lives with us. One of our supporters bought him everything he needs to have his own business because where he worked had to close. Gideon is so grateful and will be able to support himself.

I am packed and have purchased tickets two times to go join them but had to cancel due to serious ear problems that prevent me from flying. I'm seeing an ear specialist trusting God's plan and timing so that I'll be able to go be with my Haitian family soon.

Stephenson and his two brothers live with us> because their family life was very heartbreaking. Stephenson is our hardest worker and he's digging a hole for a plumbing project. We bought him a welding helmet because he works after school and on Saturdays for a welder. He loves manual labor and he's very gifted.

surgery in Port au Prince for hydrocephalus. Wedmyko, who can't straighten his legs doesn't allow that to keep him from walking around.




We are still waiting for Little Annie and me to go to Brazil and stay at a Ronald MacDonald House and Smile Train will begin her surgeries at no charge. Due to the Brazilian embassy in Haiti being closed now, I hired an immigration attorney in Brazil who presented all of the documents to

the judge and we're waiting "sentenca judicial" (court ruling) which authorizes her to board a plane to Brazil and enter the country. Please pray that this happens soon.

you and he replied, "I am alive." The kids know they are safe and no longer see gangs drive by our house. His parents gave him to me when he was 15 months old. His Dad lost his arm and was paralyzed from the earthquake.
