He cares for all the other kids and helps us so much.

tell the best part of our day and talk and laugh. It's so amazing!! They love it as much as I do!

What we would like to do is to be able to find sponsors for the kids, and it could be more than one for each child, to help those who can pursue more education. We pay for all of their schooling.





These three went to a little Haitian school last year but, praise God, that all three just got accepted into one of the best Christian schools in Haiti where a couple of our other kids attend. They have computers, a skill center, a medical clinic, serve lunch, a soccer team and much more!



Isaac, 4, is on the left. When he came, he was unable to walk at all. We taught him to walk by holding his hands at first, with braces that were brought from America. Then we had him walk with a walker, and now he can walk by himself, even though he is a little crippled.

The next one is Ebertina, who will be 4 in October. She is the girl who has no fingers and has a cleft palate. She is on a waiting list for SMILE TRAIN to repair her mouth.



Wedmyko, who was 4 in May, is the one on the right. He has a rare bone disease and his legs are on a 45 degree angle. He also has severe club feet. His

condition is inoperable and cannot be corrected.

My sister Jill sent Lorens and Robitini watches and shirts. They were elated.

I can now set up an account with a

Haitian company that will allow us to order from Amazon and we pay extra for him to fly it to Haiti and then we pick it up in St Marc, about 40 minutes from our house.
