We have been progressing on the new mission. As Dr. Sean Leach, our Vice President commented, it's like playing Monopoly. First, you get the property, save your money, buy a house, save, buy another, etc. You don't start out with hotels on Park Place. We have prepared a drawing showing the location of the structures now on the property. You can see we have built our first cottage, a 14' x 14' structure named after The Gym Station, one of our dedicated supporters.



The walls are Styrofoam and steel and make it hurricane proof, earthquake proof, bug proof, and much cooler than cement blocks.

The hot tin roof has this special insulation to keep it cool. There is screen between the wall and roof. Heat rises and this makes it cooler yet.

This cottage cost about \$10,000. After seeing it, it seems that the next cottages should be a little larger and will cost about \$11,000. We plan on 5 more small cottages in a semicircle in front of the kitchen, bathrooms and shower.

We will finish with 2 two-story cottages with full bathrooms for the managers and me along the wall.

There are usually a few kids

sleeping with both of us. This leaves sufficient space for a soccer field and garden on the property.

As Sean Leach suggested, we are listing many needs for the new construction. They include:

Ceiling fans, \$120 each, Faucets, \$50 each, 2 Bathtubs, \$200 each, Toilets , 4 at \$125 each, Ceramic tile, \$500 per cottage, Windows and doors, \$200 each, Bunk beds, \$300, Sinks, 5 at \$150 each, Plumbing supplies \$2,500, Electric lights, wiring, etc. \$4, 000, and solar panels. \$500 each.





We were so blessed to have this American medical mission team come to our house. Lorens' favorite super hero is Spiderman. He received a new Spiderman movie, Spiderman doll and also medicine for him to help him with his Cerebral Palsy. God willing he will walk better and stop falling down.

The medical team also brought a new wheelchair. In Haiti's rough terrain, they wear out sooner.
