News about the kids. Nielans. The mother of our Wesley came to visit and left Wesley's brother Nielans. She left his birth certificate with a staff member and abandoned him and we are unable to reach her. He is shown on the left. Nielans cannot talk, couldn't walk at all and is learning disabled due to cerebral palsy. After physical therapists and a neurologist visiting him he can now walk. He will even get a lot better after much experience.



Misrose (below) also has CP and was abandoned at the hospital. We we're trying to potty train her and she fell and broke her femur in 2 places. After having surgery and spending 2 weeks in the hospital she is going great and almost completely toilet trained



Sawrens (right) came to live with us when he was 6. He has no memory of his parents who both died when he was very young.



He has three more years of high school then we are planning on culinary college. He has always loved cooking and recently became a real chef at The Red Door restaurant owned by a missionary. We are extremely proud of him and he thanks Jesus for his life!!!! He teared me up when he told me how much God will bless me for all I have done for him.



Djovaney's (lower left) adoption should be finished before Christmas. It's been over four years since the process began by his amazing new parents, Meredith and Scott Worley of North Carolina.

I found Djovaney at the hospital shortly after the earthquake . He was 6 years old and had been living with his aunt when the quake destroyed their home. Djovaney was buried in the rubble for three days. His aunt died on his arm and it had to be amputated. I brought him home the day I met him. He's been in an American school and is now 14 and an honor roll student.

The present state of construction of the mission. We have 5 cottages in various states of construction right now. We have made fantastic progress on the construction and I'd like to thank all of you for blessing us!!!

Five cottages are up with screens, shutters and doors being made. They will be painted in October when a small team from Georgia arrives. Tile will be laid next month.

We put a second story above the depot, kitchen and bathroom. That space can be used for temporary housing for the older boys and storage.

We will move in by Christmas to avoid another years rent. Even though we may have to rough it for a bit, the staff and I agree we want to be on our new land.

We still need to build a tower for solar panels, plumbing, lay sidewalks, build our dining room, build tables and cupboards, buy fixtures and two small two story houses and build a room out by the well for our generator, computerized panel and batteries for solar.



The painted cottage was the first one built. It is against the east wall of the compound. The cottage next to it was #2. The picture on the right shows #3 and #4. These are, more or less, facing the other two, kitchen, baths, etc. Note the entry gate in the background of the picture on the right. Also, look behind the left side of the cottage on the right in the same picture. You can see the door connecting the new property to the leased property we now occupy.



This cottage is #5. It is the last of the small cottages. The picture above is the latest of the second story over the kitchen. Note the stairway. The picture to the left, gives another view of the second story and gives a better idea of the size.
